Scale	All features on map are drawn to scale meaning that space in the lab is accurately translated and shrunken down to space on the paper.	Features on map are mostly drawn to scale - some objects are bigger or smaller on paper than they should be on proper scale.	Many features of the map are NOT drawn to scale - tables or objects are bigger or smaller than they should be on paper.	Map shows no idea of the concept of scale - most or all of the items on the map are the wrong size relatively

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
